Holy Week is the most sacred week of the Christian Church year. We are asked to remember and experience again the week that changed the world and has the power to change us. In much of our society it will simply be another week. PALM SUNDAY - APRIL 2 AT 10:30 AM



Jesus enters Jerusalem. "Hosanna" (save now!) is our cry as we listen to the Gospel writers tell us of the events of that First Palm Sunday.

Our preparation begins in the Parish Hall and our joyful procession will proceed to the sanctuary.

THE THREE DAYS - (THE TRIDUUM)

The Augsburg Fortress Press publication Sundays and Seasons describes "The Three Days" so well when the authors write: "The Three Days or Triduum, slows down time as we move through the climax of the story of faith, Jesus' betrayal, death, and resurrection

Worship throughout the rest of the year skims the surface in some ways, whisking us through the story of Jesus' life. But in these three days we linger. There is so much centered here. We have to take our time to be able to receive it.

Maundy Thursday, APRIL 6 at 7:00 PM

It was on this night that Jesus celebrated a Passover Meal with his disciples and gave to us the new covenant meal we call The Lord's Supper. On this holy night we remember Jesus in this meal where he meets us and we receive His Body and Blood, given and shed for us and our salvation.


We listen as Jesus talks to his disciples, as he prays in the Garden, as he is arrested as if he were a criminal. The Altar is stripped of Paraments as Psalm 22 is read, symbolic of Jesus being stripped of his freedom

Holy Communion is not celebrated this evening.)

On the most solemn evening of the year, we remember the death of Jesus. Through Scripture, video, and prayers, we ponder Jesus' trial, torture, crucifixion and burial. The final words our Savior spoke from the cross are heard as the Sanctuary lights are dimmed. We leave the church in silence this night in awe of the depth of Jesus' love.

Good Friday April 7 at 7:00 PM

The tomb was empty! The angel tells the women disciples of Jesus why: "He is risen!" It is the highest day of celebration in the Church year. Death does not have the final word. Now all final words belong to Jesus!





THE RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD EASTER SUNDAY - APRIL 9, 10:30 AM



CAN A WEEK THAT CHANGED THE WORLD ACTUALLY CHANGE US?

I don't think that anyone, Christian or non-Christian, would argue that the week when Jesus was crucified changed the world. His death and resurrection changed his follower's lives completely. They went into the world to proclaim Jesus, who also rose from the dead on the third day, as the Savior of the world. Almost 2000 years later, it is estimated that in our world today there are 2.2 billion Christians, the largest faith group in the world.

I feel like I need to say that, unfortunately, Christians have not always acted like Jesus. Sometimes folks in our world today are open to Jesus, but not so sure about his followers. We spoke a bit about that in the sermon on March 19. There is much to say here, but it is not really where I'd like to go in this writing.

Rather, I'd like to pose the question of whether what happened in Jerusalem that first "holy week", has the power to change us today? Is the week we will enter on April 2, just one more "Holy Week", or do the events we remember actually still have the power to change us as individuals, as a community, as people who have received dramatic, unnerving, and yet good news?

Scripture says yes. Some examples:

"And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves, but for him, who died for them and was raised again." (2 Corinthians 5:15)

Jesus said, "Yet a little while, and the world will see me no more, but you will see me; because I live, you will live also." (John 14:19)

Jesus said, "Now is the judgment of this world, now shall the ruler of this world be cast out; and I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." "He said this to show by what death he was to die." (John 12:31-32)

There is passage after passage in Scripture that speaks to God sending God's only Son into the world to save, rescue and give new life. What happened that first "Holy Week" is the fulfillment of God's plan to save people, not just after they die, but right here and right now.

Our world does not understand this. We need only look at an evening's worth of ads on our televisions or our computer screens to see how owning stuff, taking the right medication, driving the right pick-up truck, having the right insurance, and finally, finding a cure for eczema can bring meaning and wholeness in life. If that doesn't work, there is always the Florida casinos. Now, I do not disparage the right medication, nor a cure for eczema, which indeed can be gifts from God. (I personally doubt whether the casinos have much to offer.) However, if all of the above is all anyone is

looking for, I guess skipping Holy Week and Easter is fine.

Yet, I hope you and I might go deeper. Or to put it another way, might we be open to letting God get uncomfortably close to us this coming Holy Week.

Uncomfortably close, because having someone die in your place, so that you may live, is not comfortable. Uncomfortable, because hearing of Jesus' rejection, torture, and death is absolutely not comfortable. Uncomfortable because thinking about our own death, or worse, the death of people we dearly love, is not comfortable. And yet, it is the best path to travel to get to a cemetery on Easter morning to hear 3 incredible words, "He is risen". Those words change everything!

I wish you a blessed Holy Week and Easter. If you are not in town, why not find a congregation wherever you are, and by all means take family and friends with you. The first Holy Week changed the world. May this coming Holy Week change each of us!
